

All seam allowances should be a scant quarter-inch.

Fabrics may be solids, tone-on-tones, batiks, or prints. NEUTRAL fabrics include whites, creams, very pale beiges, and very pale greys.

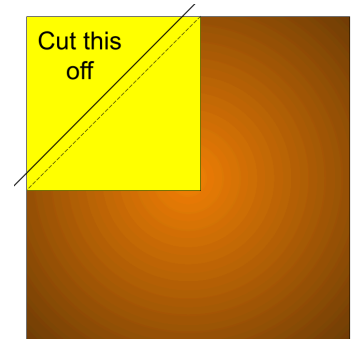
In the diagrams: Dotted lines are to be sewn. Solid lines are to be cut.

Fabric Requirements

- (1) 6½" square of dark BROWN
- (4) 3½" squares of YELLOW
- (2) 4" squares of the same YELLOW as above
- (6) 4" squares of NEUTRAL
- (4) 4" squares of GREEN

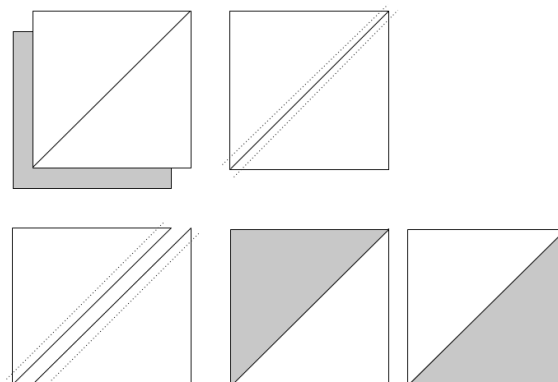
Square-in-a-Square Unit

1. Mark a diagonal line on the back of a 3½" square of YELLOW.
2. Place the marked square on one corner of the BROWN square, right-sides together (RST). Align the edges as shown in the diagram, pin in place, and sew *directly on* the drawn line.
3. Trim off the excess fabric as shown in the diagram.
4. Press the unopened unit to set the seam.
5. Open the corner and press the seam allowances toward the BROWN.
6. Repeat steps 1-5 for the remaining (3) 3½" squares of YELLOW.



Half-Square-Triangle Units (HST)

1. Mark a diagonal line on the back of a 4" square of NEUTRAL.
2. Place the marked square on a 4" square of YELLOW, RST. Align the edges, pin in place, and sew a seam ¼" from the drawn line on each side of the drawn line.
3. Press the unopened unit to set the seams.
4. Cut along the drawn line.
5. Open each HST and press the seam allowances away from the NEUTRAL square.
6. Repeat steps 1-5 with the remaining 4" square of YELLOW and all (4) squares of GREEN.
7. You should now have (4) YELLOW-NEUTRAL HSTs and (8) GREEN-NEUTRAL HSTs.
8. Square and trim each HST to 3½" x 3½".



## Assembly

1. Arrange your Square-in-a-Square and HSTs as shown.
2. Sew together the HSTs of the top row, making sure their orientation is correct.
3. Sew together the HSTs of the bottom row, making sure their orientation is correct.  
*(Did you notice these rows are the same, just turned 90°?)*
4. Sew together the HSTs on the left side of the Square-in-a-Square unit.
5. Sew together the HSTs on the right side of the Square-in-a-Square unit.  
*(Did you notice these two-sides are the same, just turned 90°?)*
6. Sew together the units of the middle row.
7. Sew the three rows together.
